Question 1. **Additional charge** - Vandalism resulting in over \$400 (Felony) 23 March 2001 in Riverside County resulting in 180 days in County Jail and 3 years probation.

Question 2. **Briefly describe the circumstances of the crimes for which you are requesting a pardon** - As a minor in 1999 I was charged with "Battery with great bodily injury" for a fist fight that got out of hand. The other party received facial bruising. I was sentenced to complete and out of home placement facility by the name of [REDACTED]. I completed approximately 8 months of treatment in this facility until I was removed for a probation violation. I served an additional six months in Riverside County Juvenile Hall and one month in a boys group home. I was released on my 18th birthday.

In March of 2001 I was convicted of vandalism. I had two passengers in my vehicle that were under the influence of alcohol. They asked to be dropped off at a local store to buy something to drink and they would meet me at my house by foot. Before arriving back at my home they decided to break several store front windows at a local strip mall. All three of us were arrested and understandably convicted. I was sentenced to 180 days in Riverside County detention and 3 years probation.

Question 4. **Provide a brief statement explaining why you should be granted a pardon** - I committed most of my crimes as a minor. I was able to return to the court system and request a reduction and expungement of my juvenile record. While I did not commit any actual vandalism I do hold myself responsible for the actions of those with me. I should have kept better company in my teenage years. After I completed probation without violations for the vandalism charge the judge dismissed the charge.

Since then I joined the Army in 2008. I served as an Infantry Paratrooper for four years and deployed to Afghanistan, Haiti, and Iraq. In 2012 I joined the [REDACTED] National Guard to attend University. I completed 2 years at Portland State University before being called up to deploy to Afghanistan for the second time and my fourth deployment. I returned home June of 2015 after 9 months overseas. **DESCRIBE YOUR REHABILITATION AND ACTIVITIES SINCE RELEASE**

Since the commission of the instant offense (not planned crime but the result of thoughtless move while driving on the highway) my entire life has been markedly influenced.

The tragic needless loss of two innocent lives caused by my irresponsible driving has had a profound effect on my entire life. After returning home to New York I attended college and completed a Master's Degree program in Criminal Justice. Upon application to the State of California I was granted an Order Dismissing Accusation Against Probationer (section 1203.4 PC) on July 28, 1972.

In 1973 I began my career as a Probation Officer, working for [REDACTED], New York, where I dedicated my life to rehabilitate criminal offenders in an effort to instill in them a level of responsible behavior and values consistent with those of our society. As an officer focus was on close monitoring of their behavior and guiding them toward attitude and behavioral changes that would further protect our society from their unchecked criminal actions.


I retired as a Senior Probation Officer in good standing during September 2000.

Since the instant offense I have had no further negative contacts with the criminal justice system.

**WHY ARE YOU REQUESTING A PARDON ?**

I have worked in law enforcement all of my life and believe strongly in our criminal justice system. I believe that I have paid for my mistake and am greatly troubled by the negative implications of being a convicted felon. Each day since the offense, for which I accept full responsibility. I am haunted by the fact that my irresponsible act caused two people to loose their lives. I am haunted by the devastation and heartache that I have caused on their families. Each morning for over 46 years I've had to deal with negative feelings that I've developed about myself for my use of poor judgment in this instance.

My strong belief in the criminal justice system has developed within me negative feelings about myself which have been wreaking havoc on my overall health. I believe that I have paid for my error as much as I can. I am requesting a Governor's Pardon in order to help me reestablish my feeling of self worth; in order to remove the stigma that I personally feel over having an unpardoned felony conviction. 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

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18 1. I am the petitioner, Bryan Di Pane. I make the following statements to the  
19 best of my personal knowledge and if called as a witness could and would testify under  
20 the penalty of perjury to the same:

21 2. I am not serving a sentence for any offense and am not under charge of  
22 commission of any crime and have since February 17, 1983 lived an honest and  
23 upstanding life, and conformed to and obeyed the laws of the land.

24 3. I am asking for a Governor's Pardon because I want my record to reflect the  
25 upstanding citizen that I am now and have been for many years. After completing my  
26 three-year probation period, I went back to court and had my case dismissed pursuant to  
27 Penal Code 1203.4. I thought all of this was behind me. However, I recently discovered  
28 that this offered only limited relief, and I feel as if I still have a dark cloud looming over

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my head even after 30 years of good conduct. I turned my life around the day after my arrest, and realized this was not the life I wanted to live. I have worked hard and lived an honest, productive life. I have raised three wonderful daughters and have helped many people realize their dreams by building and remodeling their homes. I have also helped many friends and strangers who were in need, unable to afford much-needed repair on their homes. I am requesting this Pardon to further restore my civil rights and to better prevent any further judgment based on this old conviction; additionally, for the sake of my business and my ability to provide for my family; and lastly, I would just like to have this foolish mistake that I made as a young man over 30 years ago put to rest, once and for all.

4. I was born in [REDACTED], to a very hard working family. My family is one of the core families in the East Pasadena/Chapman Woods area along with the [REDACTED] and others. I was a good student growing up, and was a stand out athlete in track, football, baseball and weightlifting. However, an incident occurred while I was finishing up at Pasadena City College after getting accepted to USC Business School, in which I severely injured my ankle while push-starting my car. I was unable to complete my finals due to time spent in recovery, and was going to have to retake the entire year of courses. Out of frustration, I dropped out of school half way through. I joined the Laborer's Union and explored some other ventures in the Clothing industry, but began to lose direction in my life. At the time of my offense, I was in this transitional period and got caught up in the Los Angeles party scene of the 1980's.

5. My conviction occurred after a friend of a friend had been arrested on drug related charges and was working with the police, unbeknownst to us. They approached my friend to try to catch him dealing, but he came to me because I knew a dealer. The dealer I knew did not want to do it, but was pushing me to do the deal instead. Finally, greed and stupidity took over and I decided to go through with it, which was the biggest mistake of my life. I immediately learned the lesson that there is no such thing as easy money, and have been working hard ever since that day to succeed in life.




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year. I am now divorced after a 22½-year marriage, and provide child support, health insurance, and cell phone bills for [REDACTED] my youngest. I see her as often as possible, and also do repair work at their house when needed. ## DECLARATION OF CHRISTINA CHERRIE DIAZ

I, Christina Cherrie Diaz, applicant in this action declare the forgoing to be true through my own personal knowledge:

On or about January 1, 1994 I was arrested and sentenced for the crime of attempted involuntary manslaughter and burglary. I was sent to CYA for a period of 4 years, but was released on January 21, 1996. I was released early as I had been a model inmate, cooperative and responsible.

During the time I was at CYA, I read, studied and took some night classes and also assisted the other inmates as much as I could. I was selected to work at CDF, fire camp where again I learned much.

Right after my release from CYA/CDF I immediately obtained a job with an auto auction as a transporter for the fleet lease department. I worked very hard and volunteered whenever I could for overtime and stayed late if asked to do so. Eventually, as a result of management noticing my work ethics, I received a small promotion from fleet transporter to Finance Dealer Coordinator as they felt I worked well with the co-workers the general public and the auto dealers. I worked hard and after 6 years with that company, I was able to buy my first home in [REDACTED] California. It was a very exciting time for me to see my hard work pay off.

I left the company after 6 years because I was offered another position with another company that paid a little better. I learned to do other type of work, but still working in the field of finance in a home loan position. I received extensive training and learned everything I could. After a short period, I was promoted to Jr. Loan Officer. The pay was not too good but I again learned a lot. After a few years I left that position for a better paying job.

As a result of the aforementioned, I am requesting from the Honorable Governor of the State of California, Jerry Brown, a review of my case and consider my formal request for clemency and pardon of my conviction as I am truly remorseful for the 1994 conviction and apologize to all parties concerned.

I now wish to apply for professional licenses and go for higher education, and your consideration regarding my request for clemency and pardon, would not only be appreciated, but would be extremely beneficial as many opportunities still lie ahead for me.

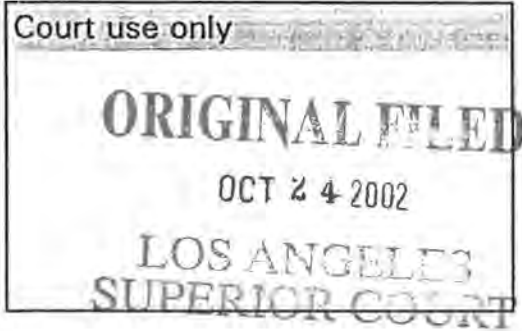

2) Describe the Circumstances of the crime for which I am requesting the pardon:

My first marriage was difficult to say the least. There were trust issues between myself and my first wife and we had a generally unhealthy relationship. Although we had lived together for a little while before getting married, we tied the knot on [REDACTED]. It was not long before I found out that my wife had been betraying my trust with another man. Knowledge of this fact only compounded our marital problems. She was an abuser of drugs and alcohol, and her addiction destroyed her health and contributed to destroy our relationship. On May 27, 1993, I chose to confront her about both her lack of fidelity as well as her drug and alcohol abuse. Like many of our conversations during that time period, it quickly became an argument and then a full-on shouting match. In a terrible flare-up I raised my hand against her and caused her injury. That moment led to my conviction for a misdemeanor domestic violence charge. I did 45 days of work project, and 3 years of probation which I completed successfully.

My relationship with my ex-wife was turbulent, to say the least. Of course, there is absolutely NO excuse for putting my hands on her, but at the time I struck her I was deeply hurt by her betrayal. She broke the vows we made to one another, and she continued to abuse alcohol and drugs, throwing away some of the qualities that I had seen in her when I asked her to marry me. We were never able to fully reconcile after this event occurred, and as far as I'm concerned, it is certainly for the better. I now have a new wife whom I love dearly. That doesn't mean I don't still feel remorse for what I did. My first wife's infidelity and lifestyle choices were no excuse for my actions. I knew better than to hit her, and I am ashamed that I stooped to that level. I let my emotions get the best of me and reacted without thinking. It was the worst decision of my life, and I will be eternally sorry for what I did to her.

3) Why I am requesting the pardon:

The incident involving my ex-wife is one that I have regretted since it happened. I have lived with the regret and the remorse, and I have prayed for forgiveness. Despite my best efforts to leave that episode in my life behind me, it is something that continues to bother me. It has also come up in my service to the State of California through the National Guard. I have applied for both a "set aside" under California Penal Code 1203.4 and a "restoration of rights" under California Penal Code 12021(c) - both applications were granted. I feel that obtaining a pardon from the Governor will be the last step in closing the chapter of my life where I made this terrible mistake. It will also allow me to continue to

freely serve my State and Country. I would hate to see the end of my career in the National Guard come about as the result of a stupid decision that I made nearly 20 years ago. I have greatly enhanced the quality of my life since that time and I have tried to make sure that my contributions to society and the community have outweighed the harm I caused in 1993. A Governor's pardon will be an official recognition for the fact that I have been changed for the better since the incident occurred.

#### 4) Why I should be Granted the pardon:

Almost 20 years have passed since my conviction. In that time, I have been productive both in my career with the California National Guard as well as in my personal life as a father and a husband. I am currently a staff sergeant with the California National Guard, where I work as an intelligence analyst. In the future I hope to work in the counter-drug unit because I have seen first-hand during my first marriage what drugs can do to someone's life.

A brief summary of my work with the California National Guard includes:

- Operation Enduring Freedom, 2004-2005 – Guantanamo Bay, Cuba
- Operation Gulf Coast Relief, 2005 – assisting in Louisiana in the wake of Hurricane Katrina.
- Operation Lightning Strike, 2008 – response to out-of-control wildfires in Northern California.
- Operation Iraqi Freedom, 2010.
- Operation New Dawn, 2010-2011.

When I went around back of the restaurant I saw my brother on the ground getting beat by three men. I ran to help stop the situation but as I got close I heard two gun shots and they passed right by me. Two of my brother's friend saw what was happening and came quickly to help stop the situation and separate him from the guys beating him. One of my brother's friends got his head cracked open with a billiard cue stick by one of the attackers; the other friend of my brother got his shoulder broken as well. One of the attackers brought out a knife, after that point I saw that my brother, his friends, and I were in danger of getting hurt by these guys. Therefore I went to my car and grabbed brass knuckles that I had, I am not an aggressive person but seeing my brother and his friends getting hurt and possibly there lives in danger I felt obligated to do something. I do not drink alcohol or smoke cigarettes. I am now 56 years old and have a shunt in my head which helps me live and pass fluid from my head. If I was to get hit in any way I could be in danger of losing my life. This incident happened over 30 years ago and I am not in the condition to fight off attackers due to my condition. I am an active community leader who participates in various church activities and am a member of [REDACTED] a church group. We strive to help others in family or personal problems and try to help counsel them in there time of need. The church names I participate in are [REDACTED]. 

## Circumstances of the Crime

My boyfriend, my kids and I drove from Kansas City to California to take the kids to Disneyland. I was on vacation in California for about four days when the incident happened. I was with my boyfriend, his brother and my 3 yr. old son. We'd gone to the Santa Monica beach earlier that day. My boyfriend asked me to carry his gun in my waistband and his wallet while his shorts dried. We went to the liquor store and ran into an acquaintance of his that told him his cousin wanted to sell the rims to his truck. So my boyfriend told him we would be right over. They came to an agreement that my boyfriend would purchase the rims and they would install them for him. There was a disagreement about whether or not the lug nuts came with the rims. There were about 7 guys in their back yard drinking and doing some mechanic work. A fight broke out between my boyfriend and the guy installing the rims, then all of a sudden there were two guys in front of my boyfriend's brother and I and my 3yr. old son, who told us we had to leave the property, so we were walking down the driveway exiting the property, when I heard my boyfriend say something and I gave him his wallet, the next thing I know he (my boyfriend) is on the ground (shoved down by two of the guys) by my feet and as he stands up, he pulls the gun I had in my waistband and all I heard was one shot...I turned around and saw one of the guys was hit and then I picked up my son and started running out of the property. As I ran, I heard two more shots. Scared, lost and confused I just walked until the police came by and arrested me with my son. My boyfriend and his brother got away (My boyfriend was caught about 6 months later). I was then charged with penal code 187. At the time of my arrest I was 22 years old and terrified at what had happened. I fought the case for about 1yr. and a half. The murder charge was dropped and I plead no contest to accessory after the fact. I served 11 more months at Chowchilla's Prison for Women.

I've made some poor choices in my young adult life. However, I want to give my children a better future with a good stability. I have turned my life around. 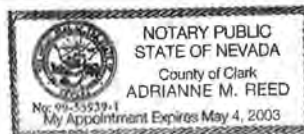



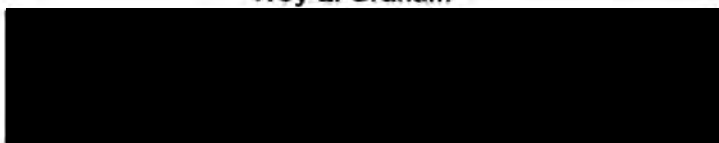

The purpose of this correspondence is to provide additional insight as to my background and rehabilitation efforts with regards to my Application for Executive Clemency (see attached application).

For the record, I remain gainfully employed as a Federal Program Manager / Construction Services Manager for [REDACTED]. I currently manage a project portfolio in excess of \$20,000,000 with projects in several countries. The largest single project to date I've managed has been \$50,000,000.

In addition to providing overarching governance for the Project Managers I manage, I mentor to other [REDACTED] Managers and Project Managers across the nation. I have authored many of the Standard Operating Procedures and Work Instructions [REDACTED] division has adopted as well as developing many other project management tools. Over the years I have successfully completed several hundred hours of additional training to further my education and to make myself more marketable [REDACTED]

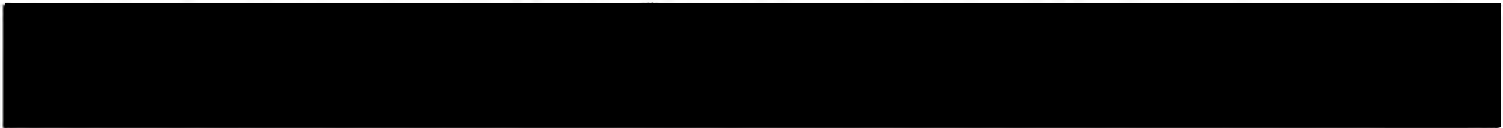

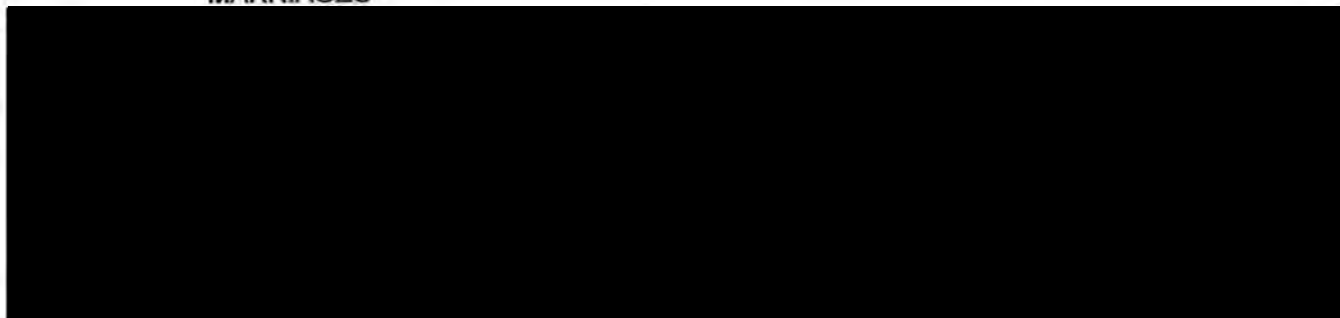

**Give a brief account of your offence:**

I was arrested two weeks after my 18<sup>th</sup> birthday for possession of marijuana for sale. I was addicted to marijuana and cocaine at the time, I was not a seller but a middle man and was caught in a sting operation. At the time I was making very poor choices with my life.

**Explain your rehabilitation efforts during incarceration:**

I was never incarcerated but spent 6 months on electronic monitoring. I was accepted into Teen Challenge in March of 1992 and completed a full year with TC.

**Describe your record in Prison, jail, parole, or probation:**

After completing 6 months of electronic monitoring and an additional 3 months my addiction caught up with me again. The first time I went to purchase drugs I was arrested in Santa Cruz county and subsequently convicted of possession under section 11350 hs. This is what forced me to realize I needed more help and immediately after sentencing went into the Monterey Bay Teen Challenge program. I successfully completed a full year with TC and graduated in March of 1993. Afterwards my wife and I worked and sold everything that we had to join Youth With a Mission.

In Santa Cruz county along with going into Teen Challenge and successfully completing the program I had 4 years of felony probation to complete. After graduation and working for almost a year we felt we where to join Youth With a Mission in Honolulu, Hawaii. This would require getting an early release from my probation to travel and to get a passport which I was successful in being granted release a full 2 years early.

**When were you discharged from probation or parole?**

September 25, 1993

**Describe your rehabilitation and activities since release.**

After graduation from Teen Challenge and being granted an early release from probation in Santa Cruz my wife and I left to join Youth With A Mission International, now the largest Christian missions organization in the world, in Honolulu, Hawaii. We took three courses with the University of the Nations, which is the training arm of YWAM, going on teams doing relief and development, working with local churches, and other activities in the Philippines and Nepal. In 1996 we where asked to come on staff with YWAM in Hawaii where we worked for 12 years starting out staffing schools and subsequently taking over as the Director of Training at our campus in Hawaii. My wife and I primarily worked there leading and overseeing the Discipleship Training School which is a University level course training students in the foundations of the Bible and trains them to go on a short term 3 month outreach to a foreign country. Most of our students came from normal familys but others came from backgrounds



such as mine and I was able to put them on a path that kept them out of a destructive lifestyle. We sent teams to serve in some of the most difficult and needy places on earth throughout asia and the pacific.

We are currently the Directors of Training at a campus here in Salem, Oregon and have been on full time staff with [REDACTED] for the past 16 years. We are involved in anti human trafficking initiatives, we are sending teams to places like Sudan, Uganda, China, Thailand, and Mynamar and are still working primarily with young people.

**Why are you requesting a pardon?**

After making mistakes over 20 years ago that affected my entire life I now have three kids and are part of a ministry that impacts nations. I often didn't think much about my past, it seemed like another lifetime. But after having kids the first time I signed up to volunteer with Little League I had to check yes next to the question "have you ever been convicted of a felony?" and realized I wanted my good name cleared. I have requested and gotten my conviction in Santa Cruz reduced and expunged under PC 1203.4 and PC 17.

I also successfully requested and was granted an expungment under PC 1203.4 for the offence of HS 11359 in Santa Clara county but the offence is not a reducable offence as in Santa Cruz.

I am seeking a pardon for my record to have it completely cleared so my name and my full rights can be restored to the full extent of the law in the state of California once and for all. I have dedicated my life to being a different person and have demonstrated that over the past 20 years in my service to many around the world. I implore the Governors office to respectfully review my record and accomplishments and grant a full pardon. I am including copys of character references I submitted to the Superior court in Santa Clara from pastors and leaders of our organization who know me.

## **ATTACHMENT 1**

As a young immature 22 year-old, I made the biggest mistake of my life. Not a day goes by that I do not regret my decisions that lead to my eventual arrest. However, I am also grateful for my mistake because it forced an immense amount of personal reflection, which helped to catapult my life in the right direction and I have not looked back since.

In 1991, I was arrested for possession of cocaine base for sales, under H.S. § 11351.5. I had a small amount of crack cocaine on my person and was sentenced to 180 day in Los Angeles County jail. I have not been arrested or cited prior to, or after this singular arrest.

At the time of the arrest, I was caught up in a reprehensible way of life. Looking back, I hardly recognize the person I once was. I am also extremely appreciative that I was able to enlist in the Marine Corps a mere five days after my release from incarceration. As will be discussed in "Attachment 3", my military service gave me both the change in lifestyle and scenery that permitted me to become the honorable man I am today.

## ATTACHMENT 2

My overarching reason for pursuing a gubernatorial pardon is simple; I believe, since 1991, I have lived an upstanding, productive and honorable lifestyle that warrants a pardon being granted. I further believe that I have rectified my mistakes through dedication to bettering my country by helping my community. And, as a result, my criminal record should reflect such efforts.

If the Governor's office made the decision to grant my pardon application, my life would be enhanced in a multitude of ways. First, I have aspirations in life that can only be achieved if my application is approved. I have a desire to continue helping juveniles realize their mistakes and turn their lives around, much like I was able to do. My ultimate goal is to become a juvenile court judge, a prison warden, or chief juvenile probation officer. None of these goals are available to me based on my current status.

Next, a pardon would further enable me to be a living example of how it is possible to turn your life around. I am currently employed as a Supervisor and Captain [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. I share the lessons of being a troubled youth with teenagers enlisted in my program. Being granted a pardon would further bolster the message I attempt to engrain upon these young individuals on a daily basis. I believe this first-hand testimony has the ability to change lives, if I were to be given the opportunity.

Last, the restoration of certain civil liberties, that I have been deprived of, are important to me. My career at the [REDACTED] would be enhanced as the result of the restoration of my Second Amendment rights. Career advancement within the [REDACTED] department is important to me and unachievable based on my current inability to be licensed to carry a firearm.

The reasons listed above exemplify my desire to receive a pardon. My future aspirations, desire to continue educating and enhancing the lives of juveniles, and possible career enhancements would all be possible with a pardon.

### ATTACHMENT 3

As touched on in the previous Attachments, I attempt to conduct myself in the most honorable and reputable manner possible. As a result, I strive to improve the lives of everyone I come in contact with. My admirable service in the United States Marine Corps, my dedication to rehabilitating troubled youths, my love and commitment to my family, and the substantial amount of time that has passed since my offense clearly exemplify why my pardon should be granted.

When I was arrested, and ultimately convicted of my crime, my life was not headed in the right direction. I was interacting with the wrong crowd and making decisions I should not have been. It is a shame, and a blessing, that it took incarceration to see the error of my ways. While serving my sentence no disciplinary issues occurred. More importantly, I was given the time to truly look at the destructive nature of my conduct. At this point, I realized I needed structure in my life and made the decision to join the greatest military in the world.

For nearly eight years I served in the United States Marine Corp. Somewhat surprisingly, the strict regiment gave me a new lease on life. While serving my country, I received nine separate accommodations and was honorably discharged in 1999. [REDACTED] After serving my country, I began to seek a profession where I could continue to serve the individuals of our great country and this is what I found as a boot camp instructor.

With my life stabilized, I soon realized that enabling youths to make improvements to their lives, as I did, was important to me. Since the early 2000's, I have been a Supervisor and Captain at the [REDACTED] underneath the guidance of the [REDACTED]. Giving back to teenagers in very similar circumstances as I was in has been incredibly rewarding. Even if I am unable to reach every juvenile I interact with, I know I have a positive impact on many of their lives. This knowledge keeps me dedicated and determined to continue making a positive impact on as many people's lives as I can.



Since my arrest in 1991, I have done everything within my power to remain on the right side of the law. I have not been arrested or cited for any offense in nearly 25 years and have full confidence I will never be on the wrong side of the law again. In 2010, I had my conviction currently at hand dismissed under P.C. § 1203.4.

I hope to further put this mistake behind me with the help of this gubernatorial pardon application. There was an erroneous bench warrant, which was recalled in 2011. The bench warrant was incorrectly issued and recalled for this reason.

My family is currently my bedrock and number one priority. I live with my loving fiancé ██████████ and three children ██████████

██████████ I would do anything to give them every advantage I did not have growing up. The opportunities available to me as the result of my pardon being granted would further enable me to continue doing this. Additionally, they give me hope and the greatest reason of all to aspire to continue being the honorable man I am.

While balancing my career and family life, I have once again begun to make the pursuit of higher education a priority in my life. I am closing in on my bachelor's degree, which I view as a great accomplishment. ██████████ I hope to show my children that never letting go of your goals is important. Once I do achieve my bachelor's I've considered a graduate degree to continue my upward trajectory. But, based on my past felony, gaining admittance to Universities is difficult.

The impact I have had is shown through the people who will attest to my dedication to my community and moral turpitude. ██████████ Through the years, I have worked extremely hard, through my profession and daily interactions, to become a respected member of my community. Whether or not my pardon is granted, it will not change my positive outlook and dedication to helping everyone I come in contact with.

I hope my gubernatorial pardon application is given serious consideration and ultimately granted. I take full responsibility for my foolish mistake nearly twenty-five years ago and have strived tirelessly to make amends ever since. My

2. *Briefly describe the circumstances of the crime(s) for which you are requesting a pardon or commutation.*

I was arrested for delivering a quantity of methaqualone, ("Quaalude"), tablets to an undercover police officer. I had provided him with a small sample on one occasion and later, with the assistance of my friend [REDACTED], I delivered five hundred (500) tablets to the same undercover officer. I was immediately arrested following the second delivery.

3. *Explain why you are requesting pardon or commutation.*

I accept responsibility for my actions that occurred more than thirty years ago. I realized at the time what I did was wrong and have done what I could to atone for my stupidity. I served my probation without incident and later moved from Southern California to Montana, where I have lived for decades. I divorced myself from the people, locations and circumstances that led me to be involved in controlled substances. I have tried to live an honorable life and have not been involved in any felonious conduct since that time. [REDACTED]

In 2011, I inherited a share of a family estate that involved a home in Florida. The Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for that property include the codicil that convicted felons cannot live or own property in that subdivision. I would like

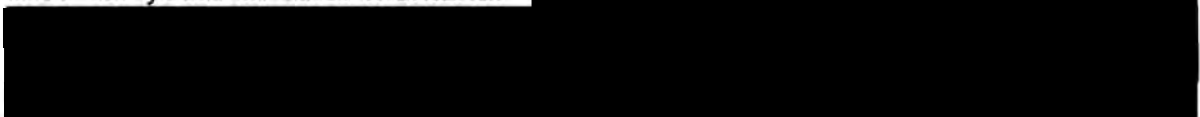


to claim my share of the estate; while I do not know if I would ever live on the property, I would like to have the opportunity to retain it as a long-term investment with other family members.

When I was a young man I enjoyed hunting. I would again like to indulge in that sport, but am unable to do that because of my California conviction. I would like the opportunity to possess hunting weapons and obtain the necessary permits here in Montana.

- 4. Provide a brief statement explaining why you should be granted a pardon or commutation?

My actions as a young man were foolish and irresponsible; I took responsibility for those actions both at the time and in the decades since. While my actions then were clearly criminal, I didn't consider them to be serious until I was arrested. After that, I did realize the nature of my conduct and tried to put that as far behind me as possible. I left California to get away from that culture and have lived for years in rural Montana.



I served my probation without incident and have avoided committing other crimes in the interim. I've tried to live my life as an honest, contributing citizen. I hope that my foolish actions more than thirty years ago do not define me as a person and a citizen. I've paid the price for my behavior then and want to resume all of the rights and opportunities of an American citizen.

In May, 2012, I applied to have this arrest expunged with the Ventura County Superior Court. On May 8, 2012, my request was granted; however, due to the nature of the charge, the dismissal of charges does not completely expunge my conviction and the record of conviction still stands. Because of this, I am still unable to legally possess a hunting rifle and my ability to share in my inherited property is still jeopardized.

I have not paid anyone, nor given any type of gift to anyone to assist me in this matter. I am currently employed with Johnson's Roofing, working a regular 40-50 hour week, and taking on the task and responsibilities of getting the job done fast and perfect. The boss depends on me to motivate the rest of the crew and to organize things in such an order, so where they will be done error-free. I also plan on attending Lassen College in the fall semester. My education will not stop with just high school. I will go on to college and eventually become a full-time student. Although jail time is the punishment I deserve, I do not think that it would be beneficial in my case. I'm right out of high school, and still a kid, I've messed up once, and probably will again one of these days. But I have definitely learned my lesson about drugs.



To whom it may concern;

I am writing this to explain why I violated my terms of probation. First, I didn't get into a drug & alcohol program when living in Reno. I was employed by the Carpenters union which has a four year apprenticeship, that must be completed before reaching max pay and become a qualified carpenter. I started working on Project C the biggest project in Reno. We worked all through the summer 7 days a week, 10-12 hours a day. I didn't do anything but eat, sleep and work, this remained for about 3 months, then hours were cut to about 65 a week. So you can see that I didn't have much time. One time I had phoned my (P.O.) [REDACTED] and told her I was working a lot of hours and couldn't go to any AA meetings yet, she had said that was alright for now, so that is why I figured I had the length of my probation to complete my program. The second term that I broke was not registering as a narcotics offender in Reno. Well having just previously registered in Susanville, and my probation was also through Susanville. I thought that was already taken care of. That was my negligence for not reading word for word the terms of probation, which states you must register in



in every city or county for 5 yrs. The third and final term which I broke was moving prior to giving my P.O. notice. I had told [REDACTED] a few times I was moving back to Susanville to work in the prison, through a union company with whom I had already spoken with, but never made it up, and then later I moved back to Susanville, and didn't immediately contact [REDACTED]. It also was my fault but since I was working and hadn't been in any trouble, basically taking care of myself and my bills. I thought every thing was going good, I do not mean am denying any of the charges brought against me. But if given enough time I will correct my errors in which I have brought upon myself. I will once again assume my responsibilities, as an asset to the community.

The driver of the other vehicle suffered a broken ankle. This resulted in an arrest, and Felony Drunk Driving charge, of which I was subsequently convicted.

**3. Explain why you are requesting a pardon or commutation (attach additional pages as necessary):**

I am requesting a Pardon from the Governor of California. I would like to request to have my Second Amendment right to bear arms restored. I would like to be able to take my son shooting and hunting with family and friends, but as a Felon am not allowed to own or possess guns. I have complied with all Court and Law Enforcement orders, and have remained without arrest or legal incident for 20 years. I would like to return to the pastimes I enjoyed before I made this mistake, and so I request to have my right to own or possess firearms restored.



At trial, I pled no contest to the charges at the suggestion of my public defender at the time under the understanding that I could have the felony Reduced or removed after my probation period and restitution was completed. In 2003, I requested a change of plea from guilty to not guilty, which was granted. However, I am still considered a Felon and have not been able to get all my rights restored. I would like a pardon to remove the stigma and embarrassment of being a Felon, and to be able to responsibly enjoy hunting with my son and family.

**4. Provide a brief statement explaining why you should be granted a pardon or commutation (attach additional pages if necessary):**

I have complied with and fulfilled all of the obligations assigned to me by the Court following my conviction and sentencing. My felony conviction was a Violation of §23153(a) P.C. I was sentenced to 90 days in county jail, a statutory fine, restitution, and probation. I was given credit for time already served in the county jail. Nearly 20 years have lapsed since my incident and I have not had any arrests, criminal involvement, or other incident. I deeply regret the mistake I made in 1994. I have paid all associated fines on time, and have completed all required restitution including probation, without incident. I have held gainful employment my entire adult life, I am a small business owner, and am a responsible active member of my community.

I successfully completed my supervised probation in 2000, and have expressed deep remorse for my actions to the Court. In 2003, I requested a change of plea from guilty to not guilty, pursuant to penal code § 1203.4. My name is Jon Sells. In 1988 while living in California I was arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sale. I am currently seeking a Governors Pardon. I do not want to discount the mistakes I made, nor have I ever denied what I had done. I would like to tell you how it happened as well as where I have been and what I have accomplished since.

I got caught up with some guys who owned a bar beside my house that were dealing in drugs. At the time I had a job with [REDACTED] and was part of the Sheet Metal Workers Union. I was only making about \$7.00 an hour at the time and the lure of easy money tempted me. These guys befriended me and it didn't take long before I was sucked in. Shortly after that I lost my job, my fiance and my place to live. I ended up moving in with [REDACTED], as I had no other place to go. One night [REDACTED] asked me to go and meet a guy that he had given money to that owed him. I told him I would and met with the guy at a car dealership. I did not know at the time our conversation was being recorded by the police. We agreed to meet in an alley to make the exchange, an exchange that never took place. I never took the product or money from him. A few days later, I was arrested. I was given a court appointed attorney and he told me there was evidence of me making a deal and that I should plea my case and I would only get 6 months. On his advice, that is what I did. I served my time and was released in April of 1989.

After my release, I knew I needed to leave the area so I did not get sucked back into that life. I arranged to have my probation transferred to Ohio and that is where I am today. When I got back to Ohio [REDACTED] with help from my family I was able to get my life on track. I went to work for a plumbing and heating company and worked very diligently to learn the trade and make a life. In 1990 I was married and we had a child together. Today he is 23 years old, my wife and I are still together and we all work together at our own plumbing and heating business that we started in 1998. Together we have grown our company into a thriving growing business in our community that supports 11 other families. We have built our business on honesty and integrity. We support local childrens ball teams and various other local efforts.

I write this letter to you today for the purpose of asking for a governors pardon. I have asked for, and received an expungement of my record, but I would like to put this completely behind me so that I may grow further in my business as well as personally. I would like to acquire more licenses that having a felony on my record makes unattainable. This will help our business to grow even more and allow us to be a more productive and contributing member to our community than we already are. Since my release in 1989, I have not had a single arrest or encounter with the law other than an occasional traffic citation. I have lived an honest life, earning an honest living as well as contributing to my community. They say the result of going to jail should be rehabilitation. If this is the case, the State of California has a success story in my life. For this reason I humbly ask that you consider my application for a full pardon so I can walk with my head just a little higher and move even further in my life.

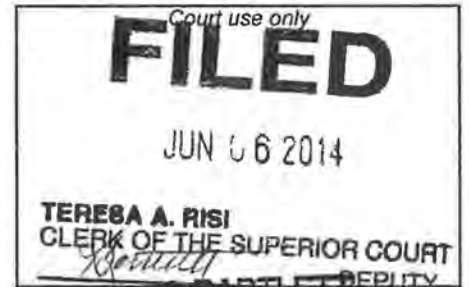

I have rebuilt my life from the ground up, removing myself from unhealthy environments and unhealthy people, and have surrounded myself instead with those who are positive and uplifting. Drawing on my personal experience, I have begun a non-for-profit organization helping formerly incarcerated women reintegrate with their communities. Now, I am helping others to follow my example. I earnestly want a pardon because I am no longer the same person emotionally, spiritually, academically or mentally, that I was previously. My heart has truly changed, and it is reflected in my work and in every aspect of my life.

In addition, I would like to become a licensed psychologist, and in order to take the test to become licensed in Pennsylvania, I need to have a record which shows no felonies. I have received a Master's Degree and am working towards a Doctorate Degree. When I have completed my education, my desire is to go into private practice. A pardon would allow me to do so, and in turn, continue to help others who have experienced similar setbacks in their lives, and at the same time give back to my community.

### **Why I think I should be granted a pardon:**

I feel I should be granted a pardon because I have totally rehabilitated my life, and although I am still on the road to recovery – I have not reoffended. I think you would agree this is a very positive sign and demonstrates my commitment to completely turning my life around and remaining free from offense for the rest of my life.

On December 9, 1976, I plead guilty to the charge, and on December 30, 1976 I was sentenced to 45 days in the Yolo County jail followed by 24 months of probation. My time in jail was shortened for good behavior, and I left the jail daily on work furlough to commute to work.

On June 8, 1979, after successfully completing probation, the conviction was set aside and dismissed per Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code.

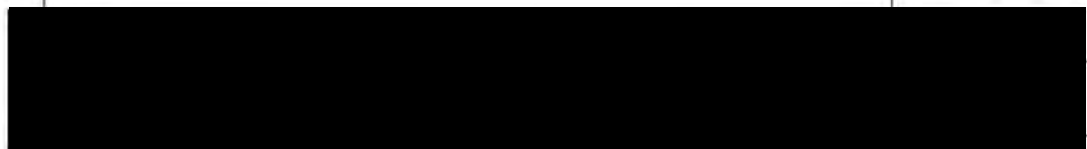

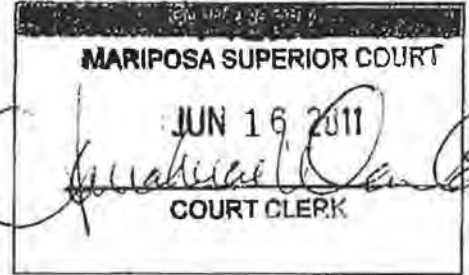



## Personal Statement

By Eddy Zheng

“The decisions that you make today dictate the outcome of your future.” This is one of the messages that I share with young people when I do presentations around the country. After being imprisoned for 21 years of my life, I know the prophecy of how making bad decisions can negatively impact thousands of lives intimately.

At the age of 16, I made a decision that I will regret for the rest of my life. In January of 1986, I participated in a crime of kidnap to commit robbery with two other teenagers. Under the influence of a materialistic mindset, I violated a family of four Chinese Americans. After a tiring day at work, the parents were ready to return to their comfortable home with their two young children to eat dinner and relax. However, never in their dreams could they anticipate that in the shadow of darkness were three callous teenagers waiting to inflict harm against them. For six endless hours, the family of four endured mental and physical suffering. As a result, all of our lives changed forever. I was arrested at the scene of the crime. The court charged me as an adult and sentenced me to life with the possibility of parole.

When I was arrested, I admitted to all the wrongs I had done to this family and pled guilty to all the charges. Though I knew I had committed a crime and regretted my actions, I failed to understand the seriousness of my crime. Most importantly, I did not comprehend the victims’ feelings. It was not until I received my education in prison that I was able to truly become remorseful for the crime I had committed. As an immigrant from China, I did not appreciate the sacrifices my parents had made so I could have a better future. I thought having money equaled happiness. I did not understand the importance of investing in my education and working hard to earn an honest living. I was naïve to think that I knew everything. I took the guidance from my parents and teachers as naggings. Instead, the words from my peers became golden truths. Because of that type of thinking, I ended up committing the crime.

When I committed the crime against my victims, I unknowingly sentenced them, my family and myself to a life of unimaginable suffering. Not only did I take away their safety, I took away the innocence of their two young children. I had no right to violate their family and impose on their freedom. I also brought shame to my family and myself. My conscience will always remind me the sufferings I have caused to so many people. Therefore, I take full responsibility for my actions.

It was not easy being locked up for 21 years. My successful survival and transformation are the direct result of my commitment to change. Education was the key to my empowerment and transformation. From an uneducated and selfish teenager who did not speak or write English, I became a compassionate and educated adult who is committed to give back to the community. I earned my Associate of Arts degree. I worked with at-risk youth and wrote a curriculum to deter them from committing crimes. I led a public speaking club. I taught alternatives to violence

workshops. I wrote poetry and published an anthology of creative writings. I taught myself basic legal aid to defend my rights and the rights of fellow prisoners. However, none of my accomplishments would have been possible without the consistent support from my family and friends.

I am acutely aware of the impossibility of paying my debt to the victims of my crime. Therefore, I have decided to dedicate my life to social services. Paying forward is the best way for me to express my remorse for the victims, my family and society. Since my release in February of 2007, I have immersed myself in serving the community through my employment in the Community Youth Center of San Francisco. I am able to utilize my experiences to support and advocate for the historically disenfranchised African Americans and underserved immigration population. I published a book, "Other: an Asian & Pacific Islander Prisoners' Anthology." I go to schools, universities and community based organizations across the nation to give motivational presentations and book readings. I love the feeling of being able to make a positive impact on peoples' lives.

I am grateful for have a second chance to become a productive member of society. However, the Department of Homeland Security's Immigration and Customs Enforcement has ordered my deportation to China due to the crime I committed at 16 years old. Therefore, I have to live with the daily threat of being separated from my wife, daughter, family, and the work I love. Most importantly, I will be removed from the country and culture that I have grown accustomed to and consider my home.

I am seeking a pardon from the Governor of the State of California. I want to be able to stay in this country and continue my work as a servant of the people. I want to fulfill my duties as a son to my parents, husband to my wife, father to my daughter, brother to my siblings, and uncle to my niece and nephews. Last, but not least, I desire the right and opportunity to "Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."





He was sentenced on or about July 7, 1998, in the Superior Court of the State of California in and for the County of Riverside, for the crime of manufacturing a controlled substance, and causing a fire of an inhabited structure or property. He served two years prison, and one year, one month parole. He was discharged on August 30, 2001, having completed his sentence.

Drew Scott Zitzke has complied with the provisions of Sections 4852.01 to 4852.2, inclusive, of the Penal Code of California, which provide a procedure whereby a person may, after completion of their sentences, seek restoration of the rights of citizenship, and apply for a pardon. He has obtained from the Superior Court of the State of California in and for the County of Riverside, an order dated June 5, 2014, evidencing that since his release from custody, he has lived an honest and upright life, exhibited good moral character, and conducted himself as a law-abiding citizen. By granting the Certificate of Rehabilitation, the court has recommended that he be granted a full pardon.

By the laws of this state it is proper that I, as Governor of the State of California, give testimony that, by completion of his sentence and good conduct in the community of his residence since his release, Drew Scott Zitzke has paid his debt to society and earned a full and unconditional pardon.

**THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR.**, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby grant to Drew Scott Zitzke a full and unconditional pardon for the above offense.
