Modifications Project

SUMMARY

The Rio Vista Valve No. 2 Modifications Project has been advertised for construction bids. Bids have been received and staff is recommending award of a construction contract. (FY 2016/17 Action A5.18: Complete design and land acquisition of the Distribution System – RV-2 Modifications Project.)

DISCUSSION

The Agency is planning to replace a 72 inch butterfly valve, Rio Vista Valve No. 2, located near the intersection of Bouquet Canyon Road and Newhall Ranch Road. This valve is used to balance the transmission system between the service areas west and east of the valve. The valve is normally operated in the closed position and is opened when either the Rio Vista Water Treatment Plant or the Earl Schmidt Filtration Plant is off line. The valve is also operated in a partially open position to increase water system pressure on the south end of the service area located west of the valve. The valve is operational but cannot fully seal. The existing butterfly valve is not compatible with the current operating conditions and needs to be replaced with a valve suitable for use in a pressure regulating condition.

On May 10, 2017, five bids were received and opened for construction of the Rio Vista Valve No. 2 Modifications Project. A summary of the bids is presented below:

The apparent responsive low bid is from Environmental Construction, Inc. (ECI) for a total of \$2,089,672. The engineer's estimate for the project is \$2,067,700. Staff has reviewed ECI's proposal and concluded the bid is complete and accurate. Staff has verified that ECI is a properly licensed contractor in the State of California and is registered with the Department of Industrial Relations. Staff has contacted ECI's references and the references provided positive comments.

Staff has also requested the engineering design consultant, Michael Baker International (MBI), to provide a proposal for professional engineering services during construction. MBI's services include attending various construction meetings, responding to contractor's requests for information, reviewing contractor submittals for conformance to the project's technical aspects and updating the construction drawings to reflect changes made during construction.

Staff also requested Lee & Ro, Inc. (LRI) to provide a proposal for construction management and inspection services to include managing and coordinating construction meetings and documentation, monitoring construction activities, performing inspections, reviewing progress pay estimates and construction performance and coordinating project start-up activities.

CEQA Determination

The proposed action was previously determined to be categorically exempt under the provisions of CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. The project was found to be exempt under Class 2, Section 15302 of the State CEQA Guidelines. A Notice of Exemption (NOE) was filed with the Los Angeles County Clerk in December 14, 2010 and the statute of limitations has ended. With the current Board action, there is no substantial change proposed to the project since the original NOE was filed. Hence, the previous environmental documentation in conjunction with the project fully complies with CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. The CEQA determination is that the proposed action has been previously addressed in the 2010 NOE (Class 2, Section 15302 of the State CEQA Guidelines) and that no further environmental analysis or documentation is required.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

ECI's total construction bid is \$2,089,672. MBI's budget for professional engineering services during construction is \$138,000. LRI's budget for construction management services is \$184,000. Both MBI and LRI's services would be performed on a time and expense basis. The project is funded in the Agency's FY 2016/17 Budget and there are adequate funds remaining to initiate this work. The project is budgeted in the Agency's FY 2017/18 Budget and there will be adequate funds for this work. The project's total estimated cost is \$4,156,000. The FY 2016/17 and FY 2017/18 project budget amounts are \$75,000, and \$3,346,000, respectively. As of March 31, 2017, project expenditures are \$726,119.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Planning and Engineering Committee recommends that the Board of Directors (1) approve the attached resolution awarding a construction contract to Environmental Construction, Inc., for construction of the Rio Vista Valve No. 2 Modifications Project in the amount of \$2,089,672, (2) authorize the General Manager to execute a work authorization to Michael Baker International for professional engineering services during construction for an amount not to exceed \$138,000, and (3) authorize the General Manager to execute a work authorization to Lee & Ro, Inc. for construction management services for an amount not to exceed \$184,000.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CASTAIC LAKE WATER AGENCY AWARDING A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT TO ENVIRONMENTAL CONSTRUCTION, INC. FOR THE RIO VISTA VALVE NO. 2 MODIFICATIONS PROJECT

WHEREAS, all bid proposals submitted to the Castaic Lake Water Agency (Agency) pursuant to the Agency's specifications (Project No. 200010) for the construction of the Rio Vista Valve No. 2 Modifications Project, as amended by Addenda, were publicly opened and read at the Agency's offices on Wednesday, May 10, 2017 at 2:00 p.m., in full accordance with the law and the Agency's customary procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors finds, after considering the opinion of staff, that the total bid of Environmental Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$2,089,672 is the lowest responsible bid of five bids submitted, and that said bid substantially meets the requirements of said specifications as amended by Addenda; and

WHEREAS, it is in the Agency's best interest that the Board of Directors, on behalf of the Agency, authorize its General Manager to accept the \$2,089,672 bid; and

WHEREAS, the project was previously determined by the Board to be categorically exempt under provisions of CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines on December 14, 2010, and there are no substantial changes to the project, and no further CEQA documentation is necessary for the Board to act with regards to the proposed actions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Agency's Board of Directors does authorize its General Manager to accept said low bid and does thereafter authorize the Agency's General Manager or its Engineering and Operations Manager to issue a Notice of Award to Environmental Construction, Inc., hereby found to be the "lowest responsible bidder" for the Rio Vista Valve No. 2 Modifications Project for the total sum of \$2,089,672 pursuant to said Agency specifications as amended by Addenda.

RESOLVED FURTHER that the Agency's General Manager or its President and Secretary are thereupon authorized, upon receipt of appropriate payment and performance bonds, appropriate certificates of insurance and an executed Contract Agreement from Environmental Construction, Inc., all of which must be approved by General Counsel, to execute the said Contract Agreement on behalf of the Agency.

RESOLVED FURTHER that the Agency's General Manager or its Engineering and Operations Manager are thereafter authorized to execute and forward to Environmental Construction, Inc. an appropriate Notice to Proceed.
