Counseling

- All students will be receiving a copy of their second semester courses on Tuesday, December 16th. If there are any mistakes to be corrected, students may fix these in the counseling office during the week of December 16th through the 18th outside of class time. Changes can <u>only</u> be made by the student in the counseling office. Requests by phone or email will not be able to be answered. Please do not call to make changes earlier than this date, as the counselors are adjusting and finalizing schedules until that time.
- Parents, please remind your students to give their teachers/counselors plenty of time (at least two weeks) when asking for college recommendation letters. Students should request this help in person and provide the writer with an addressed, stamped envelope, as well as a comprehensive "brag sheet" or resume for consideration. (Please put an extra stamp on each envelope, as the packets include many pages and get rather bulky!) Don't forget to encourage your students to write a thank you note to anyone who helps in the college application process.
- For those students who took the PSAT in October, they must attend a "Give-Back Night" on Tuesday, December 9th from 7:00 pm until 8:30 pm in the VHS theater. This important, informative night will not only include returning score reports to students, but the president of Princeton Review will help students interpret their scores, discuss the relationship between college testing and college admissions, and share pertinent curricular requirement information regarding college admissions.
